

be kept at the church and only they will use those supplies from week to week. *Include* the following: crayons, glue stick, scissors, markers and a pencil. Children may also bring a water bottle with their name on it.

CHECK-IN TABLE <u>Check In:</u> Please escort your child(ren) to the Sunday school table for check in. It will be

located by the stairs, in the old Narthex. Once checked in, your child(ren) will be escorted to their class location. Siblings will be kept together. You will also receive your Family Pick UP sheet for your dashboard.

<u>Pick Up:</u> Drive-Up to Pick UP!

Once worship is complete, go to your cars and pull up to the back Family Life Center doors (double brown doors). Please have your Family Pick UP sheet displayed on your dashboard as you pull up to the doors. The teachers or assistants will escort your child(ren) to the car. Please plan to pull forward to do any buckling so that we can keep the line moving.
