Siblings in Christ at Lutheran Church of The Good Shepherd,

My name is Andrew Bell, and I am an ELCA pastor serving St. John Lutheran in Bellville, Texas. I am writing to introduce myself and thank you for the opportunity to be considered for the associate pastor position at Good Shepherd.

To give you a short bio, I have been an ordained pastor in the ELCA for just over 10 years, pastoring congregations in North Carolina and Texas. Before ministry and seminary, I was the son of an ELCA Pastor in Ohio. In short, I have been a part of the church my whole life. I watched my father lead and learned a lot from him. I have been blessed with gifted mentors over the years across the numerous places I have served. I work and relate well with youth and adults. I have served in rural, urban, and suburban settings and generally have no issue bridging culture, political, and economic gaps with people in the community. I have served congregations with immense resources and congregations where I have literally had to call and beg for money so we could pay the mortgage. This wealth of experience has blessed me with gifts and skills that have allowed me to become a pretty capable and gifted leader in my own right. I don't say this to brag but to make the point that God has worked through me in unexpected and wonderful ways, and I am grateful for that all the time.

What excites me most about ministry is the opportunity to help people grow in their discipleship in the kingdom of God. To help them find their path. I have helped confirmation students become worship leaders and helped adults take on the responsibilities of congregational leadership. I have helped people grow into gifts they did not know they had in order to love and care for their neighbors. In particular, I love helping the next generation of Christians, be they youth or young adults, take the next step in being both committed followers of Jesus and members of the faith community. This is key because without them the church doesn't have much of a present, let alone a future.

The opportunity to do all this on a larger scale with an energetic and inspired group of Christians is what most excites me about coming to Good Shepherd. I see so much potential here to make a big impact on the community around the church. I see and hear a good vision for ministry from Pastor Chris and the staff. I am already dreaming about what we could do together to grow and more deeply connect this congregation. I want to see the elders of the church share their wisdom with young adults who are searching for what it means to be a "Christian" after high school. I want to see our little ones learn the stories of the bible at home, so the scriptures are written on their hearts and their minds. I could go on, and I tend to. But in short, I see a bright future ahead for the Church and I am excited to potentially be a part of it.

I am also blessed with a wonderful family who loves and supports me. My wife, Angela, is a gifted lay leader in her own right. She enjoys vocal choirs, bell choirs, women's ministry and is on the National Executive Board of Women of the ELCA. We have been married for 14 years and honestly, I would not be half the pastor I am today without her. She is also a stay at home mother who cares for our 3 kids. Kalina, our eldest, is 12 and in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Our twins, Isaac and Marek, are 9 and in the 4<sup>th</sup> grade. They are really delightful kids who bless us so much.

Let me finish by saying again how excited 1 am for the work 1 envision us doing together. 1 believe with the gifts God has given me and the gifts God has given your community we can make a real and lasting impact in Palos Heights and beyond. 1 can't do it by myself, and it won't happen overnight either, growth takes time and patience. However, 1 believe it will happen if we all allow God to work through all of us, answer His calling, and follow the footsteps of Christ our Savior. Thank you again for your time. May God bless you all and guide you in this process and keep you safe.
