New information about our Church Staff . . .

The last two months have been very busy as the Church Council has spent time in prayer and discernment over how to meet both our immediate and long term staffing needs. Of utmost concern is how we may faithfully follow God's leading, sharing the good news in our community now and in the future. Several new developments have come about we would like to share.

We have been very thankful for Pastor Joe's ability to serve as our Interim Minister. As he has begun supporting our staff and ministries, particularly our youth ministry, we discovered that the needs and his availability require more time and energy than originally planned. As we want to ensure the effective support of these ministries, Council unanimously voted to increase Pastor Joe's hours. While he will still serve part time, we feel these additional hours will be very helpful to meet the immediate needs of our ministries.

In conversation and discernment of what is in the best long term interest for Good Shepherd, the Church Council unanimously voted to pursue calling an Associate Pastor to support our efforts to share the good news. This process will likely take some time but know that we will continue to work diligently to ensure it is as smooth as possible. Currently, we have a call committee established that will be meeting for the first time in January. Please know that once a candidate has been identified, the final step will be a congregational vote. We share this news to make sure you are aware that you will have a valuable part to play in this process. As the work of the call committee continues, please lift up in prayer our call committee, church council and the one for whom God is working to call here to Good Shepherd.

We look forward to continuing our journey together as we strive to share God's love and grace in and through our Good Shepherd community.




