Lent 2021: From Broken to Restored

I was recently conversing with some other clergy as they shared their thoughts about the season of Lent this year. One highlighted that it feels like the last year has been one long Lenten season. That observation has stuck with me as this season is often characterized by its discomfort. A season of prayer and repentance, Lent invites us to make an honest and open investigation of our lives. To not breeze through but instead confront the struggles, pains and shortcomings. To recognize our own brokenness.



But this journey is not about leaving us in brokenness. It is instead about helping us move from being broken to restored. Our Lenten series this year is entitled: Restored In Christ. We journey through this season being honest with our brokenness and inviting the restoration that Christ alone can bring.



Ash Wednesday: This day of recalling the limits of our own human condition is one of prayer and fasting. We will be holding in-person services at 10:30 am, 5:30 pm and 7:30 pm with our online service at 5:30 pm. For those wanting the imposition of ashes but not wanting to attend an in-person *Inesday* service, Pastor Chris will be imposing ashes in a drive-through format by the back glass doors from 4:30-5:15 and 6:30-7:15 pm.

Lenten Services: Special services will be held on Wednesdays during the Lenten season. These services are contemplative as we reflect on who we are and who God has called us to be. In-person services will be held at 10:30 am and 7:30 pm with the online service at 5:30 pm on our YouTube Channel.


